

## Responding to a Humanitarian Need – The Khumpi’s Family

I have been approached to assist in the resettlement of the Khumpi’s family of four, originally from Myanmar (Burma), who are refugees trapped in Nepal since 2012. Presently, the father, mother, son and daughter are given shelter, mundane work and schooling with the assistance of the Catholic Cathedral in Kathmandu, Nepal. Their names are Mathias, Veronica, Nicholas and Elizabeth.

The family of Mathias Khumpi has been recognized as genuine refugees as accepted by UNHCR on 12 September 2012. Their refugee status has been renewed on 19 December 2016.

Canada is one of the few countries that allow private sponsorship for helping in the resettlement of refugees. Mosaic, a recognized Sponsorship Agreement Holder (SAH) in Vancouver, has an agreement with Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC), Government of Canada for privately sponsor asylum seekers to resettle in our country as permanent residents. Our parish, St Monica will work with Mosaic to help with the eventual resettlement of the Khumpi’s family in the lower mainland.

Another Jesuit priest, Fr. Gregory Sharkey, SJ, director of the Boston College Nepal Program and professor at Kathmandu University, is assisting the Khumpis in completing the extensive refugee resettlement application paperwork. Fr. Greg has been contacting me with updates of the family’s situation. He is very happy that St Monica Parish, a Jesuit administrated parish, is willing to undertake this sponsorship.

On December 4, I went to the office of Mosaic and co-signed the application forms of IRCC for the Khumpis. This is the beginning of a process that may take one to two years. When our application gets an approval by our government, I will form a committee in the parish to keep you informed and to also do fundraising in preparation for the arrival of the Khumpi’s family. Meanwhile, I recommend our efforts to reach out to this refugee family in your prayers.

If you want more information about this undertaking, please do not hesitate to approach me. I will be happy to share with you what is pertinent to this resettlement.
