I hope you are doing well there.

Here below, you can also share with the faithful in the bulletin or speak to them, passing my greeting to all there. I have shared shortly what we have start doing here. I am just greeting you and the parishioners and wish you all a happy life.

Here we are all fine going well with our pastoral duties. Nowadays it is raining a lot. We are not free to go around the villages on Sundays as we do in other dry months. We can just walk to close churches/villages in some Sundays or weekdays, the roads are no longer friendly to drive. Only with timing we can drive. The rains are not heavy in fact, but they last for hours when they start.

A happy thing to us is that, nowadays we have solar power light in our house. Through the aid of one family from there, we bought solar panels and some batteries. We are no longer in dark, and we can now use and enjoy our TV.

Concerning our project that I came there for, we have started to prepare some bricks for the building to be built. However, we are very slow because of the daily ongoing rains. We hope in February the rains will stop for a week or two. We were not able to start our project in time, because there were some local governmental procedures to follow.

In the gospel, Jesus calls his first disciples, Simon Peter, James and John.
