In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus teaches Godly logic through a parable about workers in a vineyard. The landowner pays all equally, challenging human thinking. We can fall into the same trap when comparing our contributions to others.

Instead, we should embrace the privilege of working in God's vineyard, finding meaning and purpose in the stewardship way of life. Let's thank Him for this calling.
