Take care, then, to use one Eucharist, so that whatever you do, you do according to God: FOR THERE IS ONE FLÉSH OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, and one cup IN THE UNION OF HIS BLOOD; one ALTAR, as there is one bishop with the presbytery... (Letter to the Philadelphians 4:1)

They [i.e. the Gnostics] abstain from the Eucharist and from prayer, because they do not confess that THE EUCHARIST IS THE FLESH OF OUR SAVIOR JESUS CHRIST, flesh which suffered for our sins and which the Father, in his goodness, raised up again. (Letter to Smyrnians 7:1)

Reflection... In these times, it's easy to be consumed by present cares and distractions. forgetting what truly matters - living for the Kingdom of Heaven. The stewardship wav of life, focusing on the virtuous use of our Time, Talent. and Treasure, helps us keep eternity in mind. In the First Reading, Isaiah envisions a heavenly feast with God wiping away our tears. How can we decline such an invite? Yet. we often neglect our relationship with God, prayer, and selflessness, prioritizing the "immediate" over the "eternal." St. Paul's secret to an eternity-focused life in the Second Reading is simple: "I can do all things through him who strengthens me," and "My God will supply your needs." In the Gospel from Matthew. God constantly invites us to join Him in the Kingdom of Heaven, here and By putting God first, participating in the sacraments, and setting an example, we can enter the Kingdom of Heaven today. Terrorism and extremism do not help to reach a solution to the conflict between Israelis and Palestinians, but fuel hatred, violence, revenge, and only cause each to other suffer. The Middle East need a peace built on dialogue and the courage of fraternity.

I invite all people of good will to help the people of Afghanistan, who are suffering after the devastating earthquake that hit them. Let us contribute in a spirit of fraternity to alleviate the sufferings of the people and supporting the necessary reconstruction.

To feel sorry for means to suffer with victims of the world's inhumanity, & to feel sorry for those who commit errors & injustices, not justifying, but humanizing, through forgiveness always open to another chance, to open up paths of hope & allow for change.

The right to life is threatened in those places where the death penalty is legal. The death penalty cannot be used for a supposed State justice, since it is not a deterrent, nor does it render justice to victims, but only fuels vengeance.

Let us start from the poor and we will discover that we all share an interior poverty, that all of us need the Spirit of God to free us from the spirit of the world, and that humility is the grandeur and fraternity is the true wealth of every Christian.

One of the tasks of the Synod is to journey together and to listen to one another, so that the Spirit can suggest to us new ways and paths to bring the Gospel to the hearts of those who are distant, indifferent or without hope, yet continue to seek "a great joy".
