Why St. Gerard Spent Hours in Eucharistic Adoration

St. Gerard Majella consistently seized opportunities to spend hours in silent adoration before the Blessed Sacrament. While many know him for his heavenly intercession on behalf of pregnant mothers, few realize his profound

devotion to the Holy Eucharist. According to the early 20th century biography "The Life of Saint Gerard Majella," he made it a priority to be in the presence of Jesus in the Eucharist whenever possible. Father Margotta celebrated Mass daily at the Church of the Oratorian Fathers, and after Mass, Gerard would remain in prayer, often prostrate on the ground. He also diligently visited any church where the Blessed Sacrament was exposed during Forty Hours Adoration. This was a testament to his deep love for Jesus, knowing His true presence in the Blessed Sacrament. As a result, St. Gerard is a significant patron of Eucharistic adoration, and we can seek his intercession, asking God to instill in us a similar love and devotion.

PRAYER: St. Gerard true lover of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament of the Altar, do thou who didst kneel long hours before the Tabernacle, and there didst taste the joys of Paradise, obtain for us we pray thee, the spirit of prayer and an undying love for this Most Holy Sacrament, that receiving frequently the Body and Blood of Jesus, we may daily grow in His holy love and merit the priceless grace of loving Him even to the end.



Today's Readings

ISAIAH 45.1, 4-6; PSALM: 96; 1 THESSALONIANS 1.1-5AB GOSPEL READING: MATTHEW 22.15-21

Reflection... Today's readings remind us, as Christian stewards, to be constantly aware of our identity and our devotion to God in every aspect of our lives. In our First Reading from Isaiah, the prophet emphasizes, "I am the LORD and there is no other, there is no God besides me," underscoring a fundamental truth often overlooked in our fast-paced digital world. As disciples of Christ, we must consciously allocate our Time, Talents, and Treasure each day, ensuring that these aspects of our lives reflect our service to God alone. Putting God first requires courage, especially in today's world. St. Paul. in our Second Reading, reminds us of the power we possess through our faith, emphasizing that our gospel comes with both word and conviction. Through our Baptism, the graces bestowed upon us, and the support of our faith community, we have all we need to embrace the stewardship way of life. We belong to God, and there is no other. In the Gospel passage, Jesus skillfully responds to the Pharisees' attempt to trap Him over paying taxes to Caesar. He makes it clear that while we should obey civil authorities, we ultimately answer to a higher Authority—God, the Lord of all. Our lives are a gift from God, and in gratitude, we should utilize every aspect of our lives as a response to Him. 
