

Today's Readings

ISAIAH 61.1-2A. 10-11 PSALM: LUKE 1

1 THESSALONIANS 5.16-24 JOHN 1.6-8, 19-28



Reflection... "Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing. Give thanks in all circumstances, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus." 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

This scripture reading sums up Stewardship. "Rejoice always" means place your trust in God; He will provide all that you need. "Pray constantly" means prayer should be a running conversation with God throughout the whole day, every day. "Give thanks in all circumstances" means even in bad situations, thank God. Suffering a little bit helps build empathy for others in similar situations and shows our dependence on God.

Let us rejoice in the Lord! Such is the invitation of today's liturgy on this Third Sunday of Advent. We should rejoice because Christmas is not just the commemoration of Christ's birth but also, and especially, the reliving of that saving event in our personal and community life.

We should rejoice because Jesus is already in our midst. The purpose of his presence is not to judge us but to show his solidarity with us in our effort to set ourselves free from sin and its disastrous consequences. But there is more: Jesus is also with us to make us instruments and dispensers of his joy for all.

Embracing the Glowing Traditions: Simbang Gabi, A Radiant Celebration In the heart of the Philippines, a radiant tradition has woven its way into the fabric of Christmas joy for over 600 years. Simbang Gabi, or the "Night Mass," a fervent novena spanning from December 16 to December 24, is a sacred journey reminiscent of the nine months of Mary's pregnancy.

As the sun sleeps, Filipinos awaken to the enchanting call of church bells at 3:30 in the morning, guided only by the warm glow of parols, the timeless star-shaped lanterns. The spirit of Simbang Gabi paints a vivid picture of devotion and unity, a testament to the enduring faith that has illuminated the darkest hours for centuries.

Originating as a symbolic prayer accompanying Mary through her pregnancy, the Masses gained such popularity that they spilled beyond the church walls. In an era where the majority toiled in the fields or fished under the morning sky, the novena Masses transitioned to a pre-dawn spectacle, an offering of weary souls seeking solace and spiritual nourishment.

The priests, recognizing the fatigue and hunger of their congregation, transformed the tradition further. Simbang Gabi became a celebration not only of faith but also of community, marked by communal meals featuring special rice dishes. Rice, the sustenance of life, replaced monetary offerings, solidifying the bond between the people and their parishes.

In the plaza of the church, under the ethereal light of parols, bands played Christmas melodies, harmonizing with the hearts of the faithful gathered for Mass. The name "Misa de Gallo," or "Mass of the Rooster," echoes the rooster's crow at the time devotees left their homes, marking a symphony of dedication that resonates through time.

Today, Simbang Gabi endures, though transformed by geography and time. In the Philippines, the pre-dawn hours still echo with the sacred notes of Mass, while in the North America, Filipino-Canadian communities have adapted the novena to modern schedules. The tradition remains vibrant, adorned with parols illuminating entrance processions and the joyful melodies of Christmas hymns.

Simbang Gabi beckons us to embrace traditions that transcend time and space. Let the radiant glow of parols light our path as we join hands in prayer and celebration. Whether attending a Mass in your diocese or awakening before dawn to offer a prayerful moment, let us carry forth the spirit of Simbang Gabi, singing beautiful hymns, for in the quiet of the world, God's love resonates. Come, let us go forth singing, for Christmas is here, and the light of faith illuminates our journey.
